

Oralnet's OpenVoIP - Quick Start Guide

1. Configure your IP Phone (or Soft-phone) with your username and password, and the server *sip.oralnet.co.uk*
2. Dial '0', and explore what Oralnet's system can offer you

Here are a few useful pieces of information to get you started with your new test account.

- Your full SIP address is sip:<username>@sip.oralnet.co.uk If anyone calls this, we won't charge them to deliver that call to you.
- If you notice something wrong with our system, whether it is calls that are not routing, or problems with the call quality, let us know by emailing support@oralnet.co.uk and in the subject put **OpenVoip issue**.
- If you dial a number, or call a SIP address, our system will terminate that call, as long as Oralnet are not charged. That means we can happily terminate calls to networks such as Free World Dialup, and Toll free numbers in our locale (and also those accessible through the DUNDi network).

Extensions

Extension	Name	Description
100	Echo-test	This should be the first number you dial when getting connected. If you can hear your own voice, it means you calls are getting to and from our server correctly
101	Chat room	Speak to other users of the system in a public chatroom
900	Network Status	Check on Oralnet's network status.
7xxx	FWD	All Free World Dialup numbers start with a 7, and no prefix is needed to call them on our development server
1571	Voicemail	Oralnet's standard Voicemail package. Your voicemail password will be the same as your account password, and you can the change it through the menu system
No prefix required	Charged numbers	We route call calls using UK national prefixes (i.e. always use the are code), and international calls must be prefixed with 00 (so '0033', rather than '+33')
No prefix required	Toll free numbers	Oralnet's servers use UK standard international and national prefixes. Dial a number as if you were in the UK, and if we can deliver it for free we will!
